

Three transition year students took part in the Scifest @College competition at TU Tallaght on May 4th. the Scifest@College competition held around the country. Lily, Darragh and Katie Rose worked hard on their project for Scifest as well as being on the reserve list to exhibit in the BT Young Scientist Competition this year. Well done to all three students.

Congratulations to 5th yr student Taylor Mooney who has been capped for Ireland and is currently in Hungary playing on the U17 Irish soccer squad.




