An Overview of the online module on Law.

Laws regulate countless aspects of our lives, especially our youths where their relationship with the law is complex. Most young people are law abiding citizens however it is so important for them to understand the terminology – this is where LawEd inaugurates the first of its kind courses both online and onsite tailored specifically for young people and the law.
