




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


- Level 5 1 yr PLC course

Choosing subjects:

- What is the subject content?
- Know what is on the curriculum- go on to
- <u>www.examinations.ie</u> check content
- Read the textbooks, ask teachers/ students for a loan of a text and look at the content -
- Ask yourself---Do you like it? Are you interested in it? Would this suit you?

Things to inform yourself about:

- · Career Requirements
- College requirements
- Course requirements
- Not just points

 Certain subjects are essential for entry to particular colleges, courses and careers.

Career Requirements

- Some careers also require specific subjects.
- **EXAMPLE:** Science is essential in order to maximise choice in many careers including:
- Medicine
- Dentistry
- Pharmacy
- Nursing
- * Optometry

- *Physiotherapy
- *Sports Science

etc.....

Entry Requirements

Be aware there are:



- ▶ 1. College Entry Requirements
- And
- > 2. Course Entry Requirements

Minimum College Entry Requirements:

Trinity College:

3H5, 306 (including English, Maths and a language)

NUI Colleges (Maynooth, UCD, Galway etc):

2H5, 406 including English, Irish (and a Language for some courses)

This has nothing to do with points.

Specific Course Requirements = Points +

- Some examples are:
- Primary Teaching requires from 453 points + H4 in higher Irish.
- H4 in higher Maths is the minimum requirement for many (not all) Engineering degree courses.
- UCD requires 567 points + H5 in higher Chemistry + work experience for Veterinary Medicine.
- Journalism & Multimedia in DCU require a H4 in English

NB - BE AWARE of MATHS REQUIREMENTS

Subject Balance

Be careful of over-specialising e.g. be wary of taking all three science subjects. You may change your mind.



There are lots of possible combinations....

One Science, one Business, one other Two practical subjects and one other Two business subjects and one other ...etc.

Think carefully before you choose

Too many subjects?

- Do not take on too much.
- You will spread yourself too thinly.
- Be wary of taking on a new subject in 6th yr.



Parents: Be informed & involved too

- Assist your child, discuss their choices
- Encourage your child to consider their choices carefully.
- Students should not choose a subject because their friend is doing it or because someone told them it is an easy option.
- There are no easy options at Senior Cycle

Choosing Subjects

- Do your research
- Consult college websites
- **Home Economics** Art & Design Business Studies ICT **Mathematics** Careers English RE Geography Science History Technology Modern Languages Youth Sport Music
- Talk to people you know in careers or courses
- Ask for advice

Study at Senior Cycle

- Big level jump from JC and TY
- Start a regular study routine from the first week of 5th yr
- Students who do well at Leaving Cert are those who work steadily for 2 years

Attaining your best Leaving Cert.

- To achieve in the Leaving Certificate you need to work hard and be committed for 2 years.
- You cannot sit back and decide to work in 6th year.
- So take on a subject load you can handle and give your best to it.
